

## **Arizona Elks Youth Camp**

The Arizona Elks Youth Camp is located 22 miles South of Young, Arizona on Workman Creek in the Sierra Ancha Mountain Range. The elevation of the camp is 5600 feet.

Directions from Globe, Arizona: From Highway 60/70 turn North on State Route 188 towards Roosevelt Lake and Payson. Proceed 14.5 miles to State Route 288. Turn right on State Route 288 towards Young and proceed 26 miles to the Workman Creek turnoff at mile post 284. Turn right on the Workman Creek road and proceed 1 mile to the camp.

### **Lodge - Kitchen**

Full size restaurant type kitchen with stainless steel sinks and work tables

Two propane gas refrigerators, each one has a freezer in the top

One propane gas 10 cubic foot freezer

Propane gas stove

Propane gas hot water heater

Pots, pans, kettles and some flat wear

### **Main Hall**

20 tables

100 chairs

### **First aid/Craft Room**

Tables and chairs available from main hall

### **Restrooms/shower rooms**

Boys and girls sides each contain 4 toilets, 4 shower stalls and 3 sinks. Each side has a dedicated propane gas hot water heater.

### **Cabins**

There are 9 cabins, 7 with 4 bunk beds/mattresses and 2 with 5 metal cots and mattresses. Cabins have metal lockers available for personal storage. The metal cots are movable and can be relocated to allow 6 or more cots per cabin if desired. The cabins are 14' X 20' floor area.

## **Picnic Tables**

There are 12 picnic tables at the camp. The tables are all weather metal framed tables with a polyethylene top and seats.

## **Water**

There is a potable water well on site. The kitchen and restrooms/shower room's facilities are all on the potable water system. Creek water is only used for irrigation purposes.

## **Electricity**

There is a Kohler 20KW propane gas generator for lighting in the lodge, restrooms, cabins and pathways. It is also used to pump potable water from well to storage tanks. Water is gravity fed from the storage tanks to the kitchen and restrooms.

## **Telephone**

There is no telephone or cellular phone service at the camp.
